Additional Guidelines for Mahidol University Campus Operations after the New Year

Reference is made to the release of the Thai government's State of Emergency Announcement and the provisions under Section 9 of the Emergency Decree on Public Administration in Emergency Situation B. E. 2548 (No. 48) dated the 8th January 2022, the Announcement on Additional Guidelines to Up-level the Integrative Measures to Prevent and Control the Outbreak of the Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) of Nakhon Pathom Province (No. 2/2565) dated the 9th January 2022, and the Announcement on Guidelines for Mahidol University Campus Operations after the New Year dated the 31st December 2021. To follow the measures to prevent the outbreak of the current surge of the Coronavirus 2019, Mahidol University would like to announce additional guidelines as follows:

- 1. All faculties/ colleges/ institutes and units in all campuses are to extend the implementation of the above-mentioned Mahidol University's guidelines <u>until the 31st January 2022</u>, including work from home protocols, measures for teaching and learning, research activities for students and staff as well as other academic arrangements, and screening tests using rapid antigen test kits (ATK) to reduce the risk of infection among staff, students during their on-site operations and those categorized as high risk groups.
- 2. In Salaya campus, faculties/colleges/institutes planning to organize any activities with participants less than 200 people, a formal request must be submitted to Putthamonthon District 7 days before the actual event. As for those activities with participants between 200 500 people, a formal request must be submitted to Putthamonthon District 10 days before the actual event. The information is collected for the approval of Nakhon Pathom Province.
