



**Checklist for travel documents required by the Royal Thai Government, for ensuring entry to the Kingdom of Thailand during the COVID-19 pandemic**

Thai and foreign students of the Faculty of Science, Mahidol University (MUSC), who are in need of returning to Thailand are required to send a complete package containing all the following documents in order to get an **official recommendation letter** from MUSC for further VISA application abroad:


- 1)  Booked flight information
- 2)  Booked Alternative State Quarantine (ASQ) information
- 3)  Fit to fly certificate from healthcare institution regarding the COVID-19-free certificate. It is required to be done not more than 72 hours before departure
- 4)  Health insurance must cover treatment costs of COVID-19 and other diseases for the amount of 100,000 USD
- 5)  Copy of passport
- 6)  Thai nationals must provide the fit to fly certificate

\*These required documents must be sent along with a cover letter from the Department/Program Advisor


Once Thai or foreign students have already received the **official recommendation letter** from the Faculty of Science, Mahidol University, they are required to apply for entrance to Thailand following these 7 steps:

**For Thai nationals or foreigners who would like to apply for entrance to Thailand**

## 7 STEPS



- 01** Kindly contact the Royal Thai embassy/consulate-general in your country to book one of the repatriation flights that are available.
- 02** Foreigners are require to book the Alternative State Quarantine (ASQ) and to provide a fit to fly certificate from a healthcare institution. Regarding the **COVID-19-free certificate**, it is required to be done not more than 72 hours before departure. In addition, **health insurance** must cover treatment costs of COVID-19 and other diseases for the amount of **100,000 USD**. As for Thai nationals, they must provide **the fit to fly certificate**.
- 03** **Submit all the required documents**, inform the Thai embassy, and reserve the seat on a flight.
- 04** **Continue to stay safe with full awareness** and practice protection for yourself and others while waiting for departure. For example, regularly wash hands and keep physical distancing.
- 05** When they arrive, **foreigners who booked the ASQ will be separately processed under the screening operation** from Thai authorities, checking in with the ASQ system, and traveling with ASQ transportation.
- 06** **Stay in quarantine calmly and safely** for three days; then get the first round of COVID-19 test (on day 3-5). If results are negative, the quarantine will continue for another eight days, and then the second test will be given (on day 11-13) to confirm the end of the SAR-CoV-2 incubation period.
- 07** **Travelers will be allowed to travel and stay in Thailand.** However, the residence information must be provided and the application for tracking (the Thai Chana platform) must be downloaded, which will be beneficial for public health tracing and Thai medical officials. **During their stay in Thailand**, travelers must strictly follow all of the guidelines and instructions to prevent the spread of COVID-19.
