INNOVATIVE TEACHING SCHOLARS PROGRAM

The Innovative Teaching Scholars (ITS) Program offers Thai university educators a unique opportunity to receive training in pedagogy from Stanford University and develop their scholarship of teaching and learning. The program is supported by the <u>Stanford Thailand</u> <u>Research Consortium (STRC) [https://vptl.stanford.edu/news-events/news/stanford-initiative-facilitates-research-thailand]</u>, at no cost for the participants or universities, and run by the Stanford Center for Professional Development and the University Innovation Fellows program. The Innovative Teaching Scholars will contribute to the mission of Thailand 4.0 to equip Thai students with 21st century skills so that they become creative and purposeful leaders who thrive in an innovation-based economy.

The program consists of two stages that will provide a transformational learning experience:

- Stage 1: ITS Course // September November 2020:
 The course will span 9 weeks of virtual training, and will include workshops, dedicated coaching in small groups, and self-paced projects that will help educators improve their own courses.
